Depden report

1. SCC has launched a new online reporting tool for highways defects – and it is very good as it uses an interactive map so you can literally pin point the fault the most important bit of information for the engineers. Coloured pins also highlight where defects have already been reported in order to avoid duplication and to show updates to the report.

I am encouraging all my parish councils to use it ... and having just had a look at the interactive map it would seem quite a few parish councillors have been busy logging faults. Once you have used the system for the first time it remembers your name and contact details so you don't have repeat the rigmarole each time.



The new highways reporting tool, which also allows photos to be uploaded, can be accessed via tablets and mobiles. This means you can report faults 'on the go' and these will be recorded and actioned straight away. Once a new report has been added to the system, it is instantly sent to the relevant technician or engineer. Where a customer has provided an email address, automated email updates are also sent out to them to show how the report is being progressed.

The highways reporting tool covers the areas that make up the majority of customer reports, including maintenance, road safety and traffic management. It should not be used for reporting emergencies and an alternative emergency phone number is clearly provided. The new highways reporting tool is available via the county council's website or directly at www.suffolk.gov.uk/report-a-highways-problem.

2. Kellys Meadow, I recently attended a meeting with Ian Parker, Chris Hollingsworth and Alan and Janet Willis the new owners of Coblands – and the disputed ditch. We were sounding them out to re whether they would be prepared and willing to continue to reassert ownership fo the ditch – and they are. Ian is sending them all the background paperwork so that they can understand all that has happened and then we will take up the issue again. We were told the Goodeys made a start on the entrance to keep alive the planning permission and that they would then apply for new permission o regularise what is there. We want to find out when that might be.
3. 60 people attended the meeting at Clare Town Hall about the future of our local police station. The current proposal is for the closure to go ahead but the police will have some space at Clare Fire Station.
